

Church Observes Compassion Week

The Disciples of Christ week of Compassion, traditional period of emphasis on the ministry of relief overseas, opened Sunday in more than 8000 churches throughout the United States. Major portion of the receipts is earmarked for assistance of needy persons overseas.

An added \$150,000 is being sought for a special housing project to aid six Puerto Rican churches in New York City, organized by members of Disciples of Christ mission congregations in Puerto Rico who have moved to New York. Overall theme of the Week of Compassion is: "This Week We Share."

The Vernonia First Christian church will serve a luncheon at 5 p.m. Sunday, February 24 at the church to observe the Day of Sharing. Offering envelopes

and boxes were distributed last Sunday. They will be emptied and the contents dedicated during a program in the sanctuary after the luncheon. A film strip, "We Share", will show the areas need that will be met by the Week of Compassion offering.

Members and friends of the church are invited and urged to attend the luncheon and program.
