AROUND THE FARM

Present ragweed laws are being considered for revision by the legislature. Although Columbia county has only some small infestation of ragweed which is being watched closely, farmers and the general public will be interested to know that the proposed new law, H.B. 283 no longer places the responsibility for the control of this weed on the landowner. The bill introduced into the house would create a ragweed control district that includes Columbia county and 16 other counties of Western Oregon. The responsibility for carrying out the provisions of this bill would be placed with the

state department of agriculture and would provide funds for controlling ragweed except in the case of federal and state agencies, county courts, municipalities, school districts, water districts, irrigation districts, public utilities and other public bodies. In such cases these groups would take care of the weed at their own expense. Ragweed is a public nuisance in that the pollen it sheds causes hay fever in many people. If allowed to go uncontrolled it could cause a reduction in tourists to this state which had been relatively free of ragweed until the last few years. And our

tourist business is important in that it is the third largest income producer in the state. Farmers as such are not greatly concerned with the control of ragweed in that it is just another weed that competes with their crops. It does not offer heavy competition and it is not poisonous or harmful. New fertilizer materials will be hitting the market this year. We have no indications about price at this time and no indication of how much of these fertilizers will be available. Most farmers are familiar with 16-20 ammonium phosphate. The phosphorus of all these new fertilizers will be in the ammonium phosphate form. These new fertilizer ma-

terials differ from ones like 16-20 in that most of them are complete fertilizers, meaning that they also contain potash. They also have a percentage of sulfur which is important in our area where we are deficient in this element. The analysis of some of these new materials is designated as 6-24-24, 8-32-16, 10-32-10, 12-12-12, and 13-39-0. The first number is the percentage of nitrogen, then phosphorus, and then potassium. These new fertilizers should help farmers meet the needs of specialty crops on the many different soil conditions that we have. Liquid lime sulfur can be a most important spray material

for the commercial orchardist as well as the home gardener. Many growers have already applied lime-sulfur as a dormant spray to apples and pears. It is also good material to use now on all cane fruits and on roses. Caution needs to be exercised if using lime-sulfur around buildings where the spray might come in contact with painted surfaces. The sulfur in the spray reacts with the lead of the paint. Vern Kohlstrand, dairyman at McNulty, was again quoted in the February 10 issue of Hoard's Dairyman, a national publication. The subject of the article was "How We Established a Thick Stand" and referred to methods used in seeding and es-

tablishing pastures. While not all of the items contained in the article apply to this area, we feel that folks who have an opportunity to see the magazine will get a great deal from this.
