## Witnesses Plan Week End Meet

Approximately 85 Jehovah's Witnesses from the Forest Grove congregation will attend the three day Christian ministry training conference which is to be held at the Lebanon, Oregon armory March 22-24, according to H. L. McFarlan, presiding minister of the local congregation. Climax of the gathering will be a public address on "Overcoming the Barrier Dividing Mankind" by W. D. Couch, district minister from Brooklyn, New York.

The get-together is a regular feature of each circuit of Jehovah's Witnesses, and is arranged under the direction of the Watchtower Society of Brooklyn, New York. The Lebanon assembly, which is expected to have a total attendance of 1200 is for Oregon Circuit No. 4, which is made up of congregations from 18 Willamette valley and coastal towns. The group will attend and participate in sessions of Bible discourses, demonstrations, and workshops designed to instruct them in the most helpful methods of carrying on the house-to-house and home Bible study features of their ministry. Sessions will be interspersed with visits to homes in the Lebanon area. The same means are used by over a half million witnesses in 162 lands to carry out their ministry. Mr. McFarlan mentioned that all sessions will be open to the public and that no collections will be taken.
