The club will meet January 10 at the home of Mrs. Vanderzan-den for the New Years party.



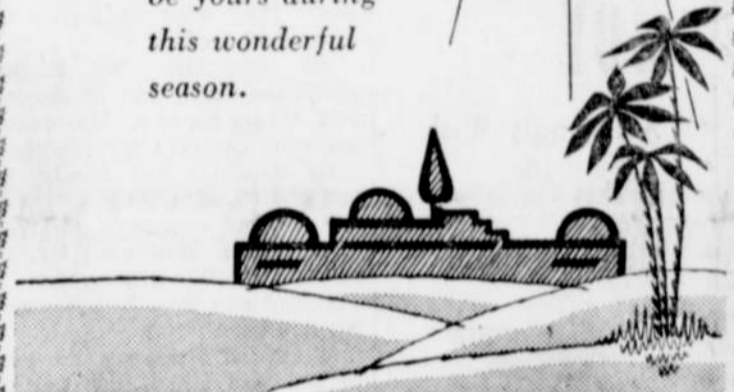
