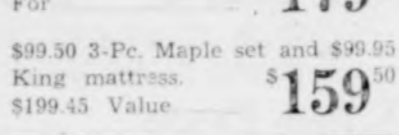

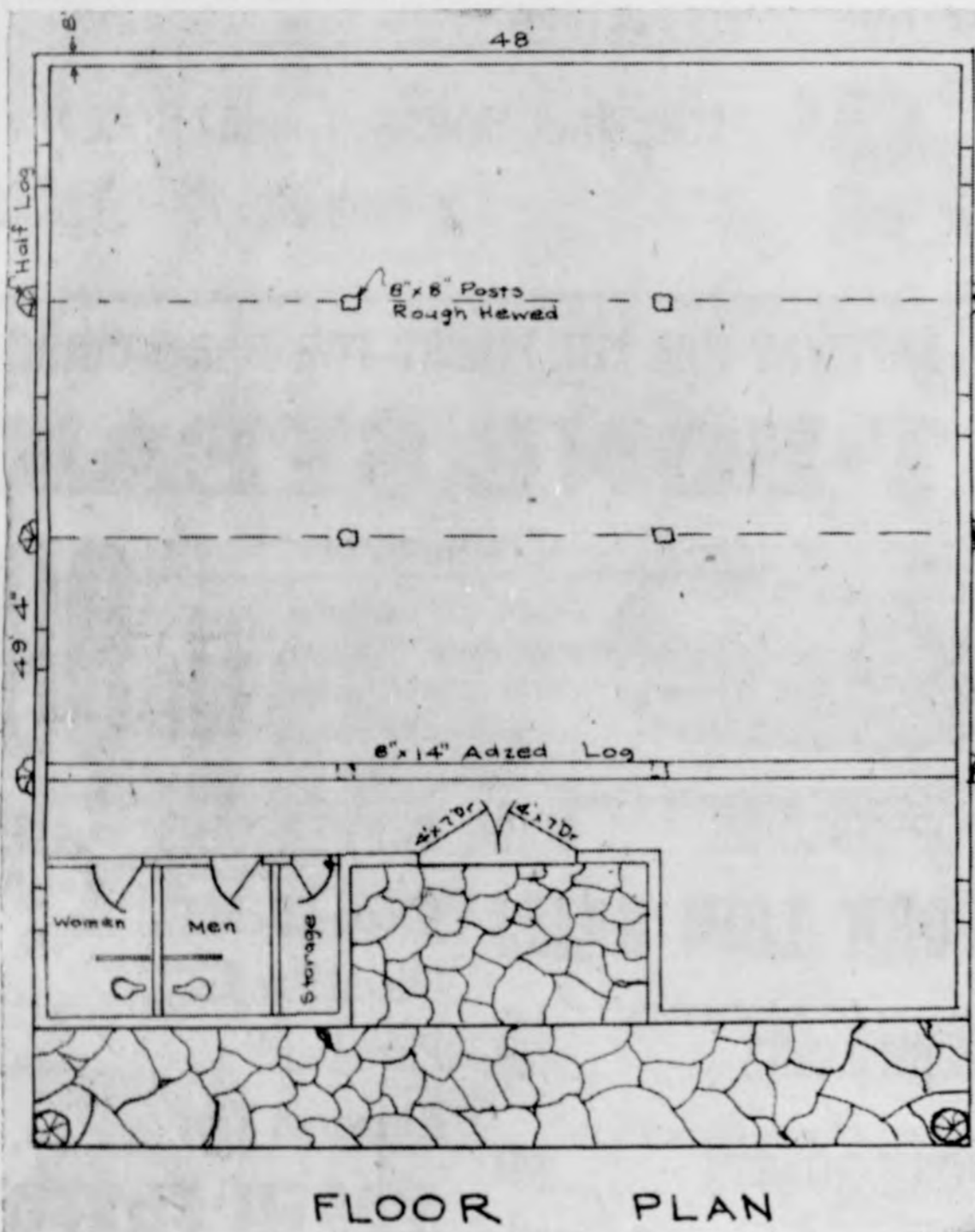

### Neuberger Urges S.S. Increases

Senator Richard L. Neuberger announced today that 135,503 Oregon residents were receiving monthly Social Security benefits totaling \$7.3 million monthly. In Columbia county 2,134 recipients draw \$121,144 monthly.

The Social Security figures for 1957, just released by the department of health, education and welfare, cover benefits for retired workers, wives or husbands, children, widows or widowers, mothers, parents and disabled workers.

Social Security disability benefits, for those totally disabled between the ages of 50 and 64 are paid to 1,217 Oregon workers. Senator Neuberger co-sponsored this amendment to the Social Security law which was adopted in 1956 and provides that totally disabled workers over 50 years of age are eligible for benefits.

Neuberger said that another 1958 amendment he sponsored, lowering the women's retirement age to 62, means that some 300,000 women throughout the country between the ages of 62-64

are receiving retirement benefits for the first time.

"Because of the ever-increasing high cost of living," Neuberger said, "I am urging adoption of legislation now in the Senate to provide a cost-of-living increase in Social Security benefits so that they will more adequately reflect today's needs."

Marian B. Folsom, secretary of health, education and welfare reported that more than 11 million persons are now receiving Social Security benefits at a monthly rate of \$606 million. This represents an increase of 2 million beneficiaries as a result of 1958 amendments to the Social Security law which provided coverage for the first time to the self-employed, women aged 62-64, and totally disabled workers aged 50-64.

### Farmers Fail to Claim Gasoline Tax Refunds

Gasoline tax refunds are not being claimed by many farmers eligible to receive them, according to internal revenue service figures, says County Extension Agent, Don Coin Walrod.

Last year only 1.2 million farmers received gas-tax refunds out of the 4.8 million farmers eligible to make claims for the 3-cent-per-gallon rebate.

This refund is paid on every gallon of gas used for farm production purposes. Farmers that made claims last year should receive claim forms for this year by mail. Farmers not receiving refund application forms should request form 2240 from the district director of the internal revenue service, Portland.

The deadline for filing applications covering gasoline used July 1, 1957 through June 30, 1958 is September 30 this year, says Walrod.

Young drivers now being properly trained will reduce future traffic accidents, but population increases require a rapid expansion of driver training facilities. Fourteen states are offering financial aid to driver education programs, setting a pattern that will help provide adequate driver education courses for more high school students.
