Endothal Suggested For Control Of Veronica

Veronica, a common lawn weed, is best controlled with spring applications of Endothal, says Hugh J. Hickerson, Columbia county extension agent.

Veronica, also known as speedwell, is a low growing weed with small blue or bluish-white flowers. The weak stems spread over the surface of the ground. The leaves and flowers are about the same size, each a quarter to third inch in diameter. Veronica leaves are usually a lighter green than the grass and have a "soft" fuzzy appearance.

Endothal is available at most garden supply dealers. Follow the directions on the label of the container. Endothal may cause some burning on the lawn grass, especially the fescues, but the grass will recover quickly.

Azaleas Require Disease Sprays

Evergreen azaleas should be sprayed just before the buds open before blooming according to Hugh J. Hickerson, county extension agent. The purpose of this spray is to control an insect, the leaf miner and a disease, leaf gall.

DDT or malathion should be used to control the leaf miner, a puritized agricultural spray, ferbam, or copper A. compound is recommended for leaf gall. The spray for leaf miners may be combined with the one for leaf gall.

The second spray application should be made two or three weeks after the first. It may be necessary to further repeat the spray for leaf miners every couple of weeks to control them.

Azalea leaf miners roll, skeletonize, and mine the leaves by mining between the upper and lower leaf surfaces. They cause brown blotches on the leaf.

Azalea leaf gall appears as a thickening or fleshiness of the leaf with a bright bloom of spores. At first the diseased leaves are quite succulent and white in color, but later turn into hard, brown, gall-like bodies. These galls are composed of fungi or infected plant tissues.
