The Board of Education, School District No. 47 Jt., Vernonia, Oregon, will open sealed bids at 9 o'clock P.M., Thursday, July 21, 1960, at the high school for the following:

School bus to transport grade school students living on Fishhawk Road to Mist Grade School and return plus high school students to highway to meet high school bus to Vernonia.

Description of run is as follows:
Vehicle must travel Fishhawk Road on morning run to bring high school students to highway for connection with high school bus to Vernonia. Then vehicle must travel Fishhawk Road to bring grade school students to Mist. For afternoon run the vehicle must transport the grade school students from Mist up Fishhawk Road then meet high school bus at highway and transport students up Fishhawk.

Estimated mileage per day is 65-70 miles. The vehicle will transport from 7-10 students at one time so a regular station wagon will not be adequate. Minimum standards for school buses, 1958 edition, State of Oregon, states:

ORS 485.010 (b) defines "school bus" as . . . any vehicle having seating accommodations for eight passengers or more while exclusively engaged in transporting children, and having displayed in a conspicuous place on the front and rear thereof the words "School Bus" in letters not less than eight inches in height and of proportionate width . . .

Conversion Vehicle: Any school bus having seating accommodations for from 8 to 12 passengers, inclusive.
Effective Date—April 1, 1958—Any school bus purchased on or after above date must be equipped with flashing red warning lights and stop lights as listed herein.

Any interested bidder may examine standards for school buses at the superintendent's office.

Bids must be stated on a per mile basis. The Board of Education reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
