## Hickman Stationed At Virginia Naval Air Base

On Jan. 8, the squadron will mark its 10th birthday. It recently placed its last North American "Fury" jet with the new super-sonic Chance Vought "Crusader," the latest in a series of utility aircraft stretching back to the Gruman "Hellcat" of World War II.

## Two Serving in US First Fleet

George W. Wood, aviation ordnanceman third class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Herman Wood of Mist route is serving aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Kitty Hawk, operating with the First Fleet out of San Diego, Calif.

Commissioned last April, the Kitty Hawk is the first carrier in the world to be armed entirely with guided missiles.

Darrell R. Elliot, fireman apprentice, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Elton A. Elliot of Mist route is serving aboard the guided missile light cruiser USS Topeka, a unit of the First Fleet which took part in Exercise Black Bear from Nov. 24 through Dec. 1, off the coast of Southern California.

Involving some 10,000 men and 16 ships, the training operation centered around a fast carrier striking force subjected to air and sub-surface attack.

Opposition was provided by jet and conventional aircraft and by submarines, simulating attacks with all types of weapons. During the exercise the striking force was replenished at sea by fleet oilers, stores ships and ammunition ships.

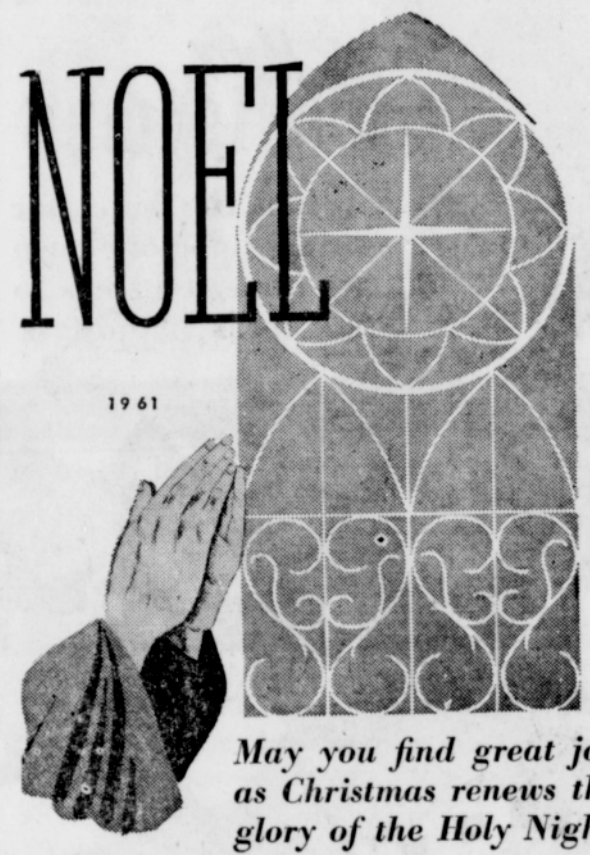
