**Senate Record Topic of Talk**

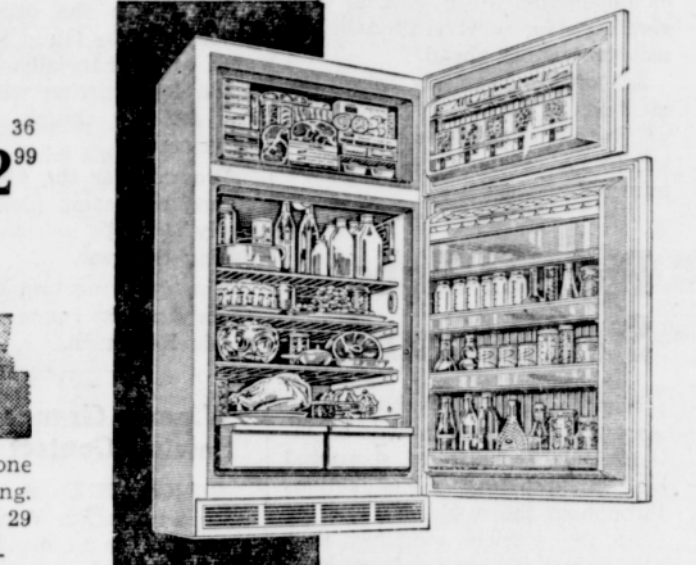
Columbia county Republicans, 150 strong, turned out for a Sunday picnic to hear Sig Unander give his opinion of the record of Oregon's senior senator. Also speaking briefly were the candidates for office in the county, Robert Welwood, Mel Gregory, Roy Wilburn and Lawrence Meissner.  
Republican control of the state house of Representatives was predicted by State Central Committee Representative Fred VanNatta. He also urged all Republicans to register, work for Republican candidates and vote.  
County Republican Chairman Gene Carpenter, master of ceremonies, told the crowd that he was very pleased at the turnout. He pointed out that the attendance was much larger than at a comparable picnic held by the Democrats on the preceding Sunday. Gene also announced that this was the first of what he hoped would be an annual event.  
Dick Leith, picnic chairman, spoke briefly and said he was happily surprised at the number and enthusiasm of those attending. The main course for the picnic was barbecued beef donated by local Republican farmers.

The limit on the purchase of E Bonds in any one calendar year by any one person remained unchanged at \$10,000 maturity value.
