#### Two Accidents Cause Injuries

The Vernonia ambulance was called Wednesday of last week to take W. T. Craig of 1251 Second avenue to the Veterans hospital in Portland after an accident with a power saw which he was using in some work on his house. His hand was badly mangled and the thumb was almost severed.

The same afternoon, Dick Nightwine was the victim of a gun accident. He was trying out an Italianmade seven millimeter, using a hand-loaded shell. The shell exploded in the gun and blew particles of brass back through the bolt into his face, causing extensive cuts on his nose and cheek and imbedding a number of particles that cannot be removed. Since the ambulance was already in use, he was taken by James Davies to the Tuality hospital where

he remained until Friday. Dick stated this week that he hoped his experience, which has been both painful and costly, will serve as a warning to others to use care in handling unfamiliar guns and also as to the ammunition used. Sometimes handloads are heavier than called for for certain types of guns.


