T. Texas Tyler, known as "The Man with a Million Friends," one of the foremost country and western artists for many years, will be featured at a service in the Assembly of God church Friday, September 28, 7:30 p.m., according to Rev. Wm. C. Armstrong, pastor.

It will mark one of the few appearances in this area by Tyler, a man who, until recently, spent his time touring throughout the United States and Canada headlining "Grand Ole Opry" shows, appearing with his large band in ballrooms, clubs and on TV.

He will tell the amazing story of how he decided to quit his life to become a preacher of the Gospel. He will also be playing his guitar and singing many Gospel songs.

He has the distinction of being one of the very few country and western artists to ever appear in concert at New York's famed Carnegie Hall. He also has been under contract to Columbia Studios in Hollywood in the making of Western movies.

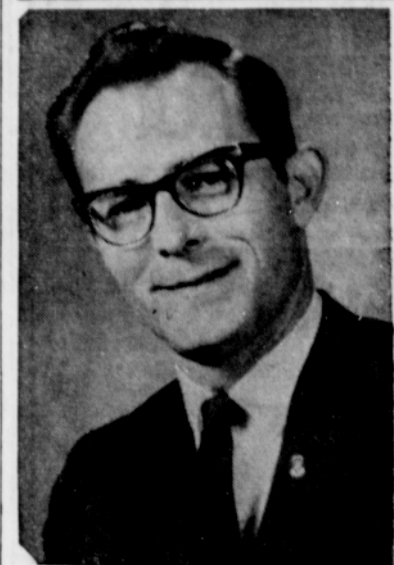
