This statement on weather forecasting, issued to the general public by the American Meteorological Society in "Weatherwise", the magazine about weather, was furnished to the Vernonia Eagle by Mrs. Helen Spofford, local weather observer.

"One of the important activities in the field of meteorology is the preparation of weather forecasts as a vital public service. Weather forecasts are used by individuals to guide their daily living and by industry, agriculture, forestry, commerce and government to guide their operations.

The widespread need for accurate, advance weather information and the critical dependence of public safety and welfare upon the quality of such information make it desirable to describe the present weather forecasting capability of the meteorological profession."

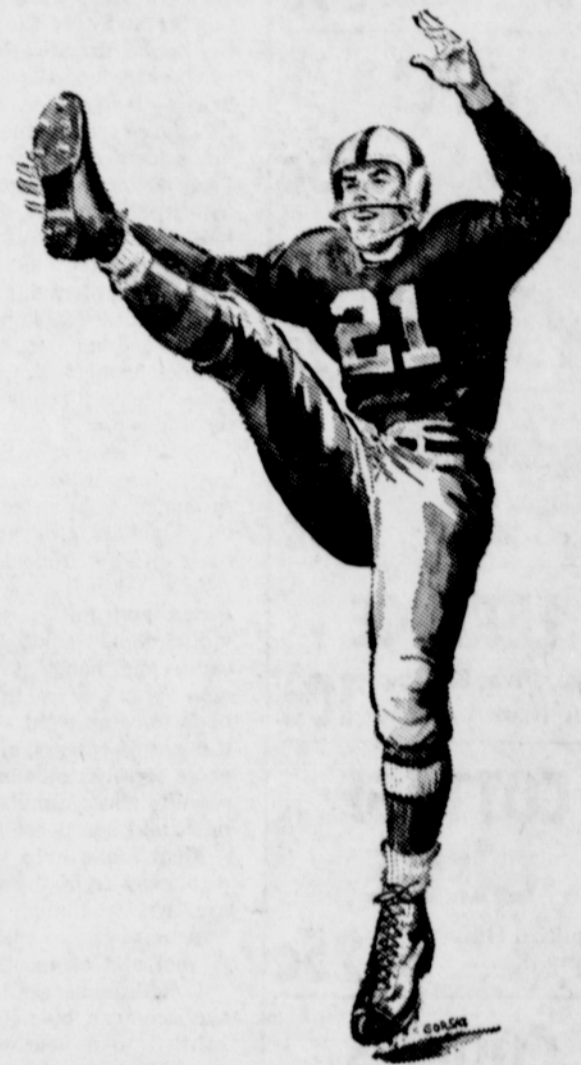
