ANSWER: You should notify your social security office of your increased salary and give a revised estimate of your earnings for this year. This will not be necessary next year when you will be over 72 in all months of the year. But this year it is, because your total earnings must be counted in determining whether you have any social security benefits coming to you for the months of January, reduction will not be as great. February and March, before you reached 72.

QUESTION: I have heard that the social security tax rate will go up in January 1963. Would you tell me what the tax rate is scheduled to be for that year?

ANSWER: Beginning with January 1963, the social security tax rate will be 35% % for both employers and employees. For selfemployed people, the rate will be 5.4%

QUESTION: I'm retired, but I'm planning to take a job that will pay me about \$3,000 a year. Is there anything I should do concerning my social security checks? ANSWER: Notify your nearest secial security office of your new job. Since you expect to earn more than \$1200 a year, you must make an annual report in which you estimate your earnings to social security not later than April 15 of each year. Later, if you find that your actual earnings will be different from your estimate, notify your social security office again. An adjustment will be made and you will receive the proper amount of benefit pay-

ments. QUESTION: Right now, I'm between jobs" and I've exhausted all of my unemployment benefits. Since I will be 62 in two months, could I apply for my old-age benefits now until I find another job? ANSWER: By all means. But remember your benefit will be reduced from what it would have been had you waited until age 65 to apply. However, if, when you are between 62 and 65, you do not receive all of your benefit

QUESTION: What kind of workers are considered household workers under the social security law?

ANSWER: Maids, cooks, gardeners, valets, chauffeurs, etc., who perform household work in or about a private home. This includes babysitters, whether adult or teenage, who come to a private home regularly to care for child-

QUESTION: Will my benefits start automatically when I reach 65?

ANSWER: No. You must apply for your social security benefits in order to get them. You can do this at your nearest social security district office. You will find the address listed in your phone book under: "U.S. Government, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Social Security Administration."

QUESTION: I had a severe heart attack and have not been able to work for the last two months. May I receive disability benefits immediately?

ANSWER: No. Disability insurance benefits are available to a workers whose illness or injuries are so severe that it is expected to exist for a long time. If all the requirements in the law are met, benefits are payable after a six months waiting period - usually the 7th month from the date when the impairment began.

Aside from his home, the average American has more money invested in his automobile than in any other single possesion.

Driving and then owning an automobile become of paramount importance at an early age, and rarely does the thrill of owning a car lessen with the years.

Driving for pleasure, according to a massive report by the Outdoor Recreation Resources Review Commission, is the nation's favorite outdoor recreational activity. 
Renewal reminders will soon be in the mail to car owners whose license plates expire in November.
