## Pomona Grangers Hear Delegates Tell of Trips During The Summer

The Columbia county Pomona Grange met Saturday, November 3 in the Chapman Grange hall with a good attendance. Also, Don Coin Walrod, county agent, advocated that any buildings lost might be modernized in being rebuilt.
