



Four Complete Basic Training

News has been received from San Diego concerning four local boys who have just completed basic training at the Naval base. Lester R. Chambers, son of Mrs. Betty M. Pagh; Johnny L. Biggs, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Biggs and John D. Foss, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Townsend all completed recruit training, October 26, and Claud E. Weaver, son of Mr. and Mrs. Claud E. Weaver Sr. of Timber route completed his November 2.

During the nine-week indoctrination, recruits are trained in physical fitness, basic military law, military drill, customs and etiquette of the naval service, swimming and survival, first aid and basic shipboard routine.

During the training, recruits receive tests and interviews which determine future training and assignments.

Chambers, Biggs and Foss are now home on 14 day leaves and Weaver is expected home this week end. Chambers will return to San Diego for schooling. It is understood that Biggs will be sent to Florida and Foss to a desert missile base. Weaver goes to Tennessee for schooling.
