The courses will be divided into two sessions each night and those attending will be able to complete the whole course. Unit number 1 consists of the fundamentals of teaching procedure and the techniques and understanding agegroup characteristics. Every parent should take this course and find out why children do what they do at different ages. A well adjusted child usually comes from a family that is aware of agegroup characteristics.

Unit number 2 deals with modern methods of teaching, visual aids, materials available for Sunday school and training classes for the church. There will be time each night for questions and special problems.

Each class will be held from 7:00 to 7:50 and then a coffee break, and time of getting acquainted until 8:10 when the next class will take up.

There will be a charge of 50c per night or \$2.00 for the week. Registrations can be made in advance by contacting any member of the ministerial association.

### **Rites Held For** Early Resident

Funeral services were held Saturday at Fuitens Chapel in Forest Grove, for Thomas Turk, aged 87, who formerly was a resident of this area near the county line on Timber road.

He was born December 16, 1874 in Clinton, Missouri. At the age of five, he came with his family to San Francisco by train and from there to Portland by boat. After residing there for several years, his family homesteaded in the upper Nehalem valley between Vernonia and Timber.

In 1896, he was married here to Bertha Thomas, sister of Lloyd Thomas. They were honored last year on the occasion of their 65th wedding anniversary.

For 40 years, Mr. Turk farmed in the Manning district. In 1947 he retired and moved to Gaston.

He is survived by his wife, Bertha; four sons, Louis of Banks, Lloyd of Canby, Frank of Cornelius and Floyd of Salem; a daughter, Mrs. Sam Williams of Gaston; 10 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.
