Early Filing Speeds Claims

The first part of every year hundreds of people eligible for social security payments decide to file for their benefit. The impact of all these claimants filing at one time results in slower processing of claims and delay in sending out the first check. Frank J. Laheney, field representative of the Social Security administration office in Portland is as anxious to forward the applications for payment as each wage earner is to receive his check.

In an effort to pay claims as quickly as possible, Mr. Laheney suggests that anyone contemplating retirement within the next three months should come in to talk to one of the staff. An application for benefits can be filed as much as three months before retirement age. Filing an application before the end of this year will assist the social security people in making quicker payment to those filing now, as well as speed up payment to those who for one reason or another cannot file until some time next year.

Anyone reaching retirement age should check with the social security office as to their rights to benefits. Due to a liberalization of the Social Security Act in 1961 many wage earners even though they continue to work may be entitled to some benefits. Any insured person of retirement age earning \$1200 or less a year can draw all his benefits for that year. In the event of earnings over \$1200 the amount payable diminishes as the earnings increase.

Mr. Laheny said that the slogan, "Inquire Before You Retire" should be kept in mind by everyone. The Social Security administration office is located at 1205 S.W. 13th avenue. The telephone number is CApitol 6-3361. If it is inconvenient to call at the Portland district office, a representative is at St. Helens every Monday at the Columbia county court house - sheriff's office, ground floor. The hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.


