## Late Lambing To Be Prevented

Rams turned in with ewe flocks this month will sire lambs late in January and February. Such timing should result in 90 to 100 pound lambs by mid-May and early June, says Don Coin Walrod, county extension agent.

Lamb markets in Western Oregon are always best in May and June. Flushing ewes will help to get early lambs, says Walrod. Flushing can be done by putting ewes on a better quality feed shortly before breeding. This can be done by feeding one-half to three-quarters pound of grain to each ewe daily, starting about seven to 14 days before rams are turned in with the ewes. Because of the effect on the breeding cycle, flushing will result in a more closely spaced lamb crop and greater uniformity at marketing.

To make sure that lambs don't continue to arrive in the late spring, rams should be removed from the flocks by October 15 to 20. Ewes that are not bred by this date are generally poor producers and should be culled from the flock.

**QUESTION:** I am unemployed, but my wife is working. She gets a vacation for two weeks this month and I am going to accompany her to Colorado. Can I continue to receive unemployment insurance benefits while I am gone?

**ANSWER:** For the two weeks you will be away, you cannot receive benefits because you obviously will not be available for work should employment be offered you and you will not be looking for work as stipulated in the Oregon Department of Labor law. You should report to your local office of the Department of Employment that you will be away for two weeks and report again upon your return so that the claims deputy knows that you are back and ready and looking for employment.

## Forest Group Certifies Farm

Certified tree farmers, which provide needed raw materials for Oregon's principal industry, pay taxes just like every other private property owners, said Paul E. Ehinger, president, Industrial Forestry association, in announcing new tree farm certifications. He added that tree farmers pay taxes each year not only on their land but also on all timber 12 inches or over in diameter.

Three tree farms totaling 2,979 acres in one Washington and two Oregon counties were approved by the IFA board. In addition, five tree farm certificates were canceled and one tree farm certificate was transferred to a new owner.

One of the farms, Tannenbaum Acres, is owned by Russell and Doris Pierson and is located in Columbia county.
