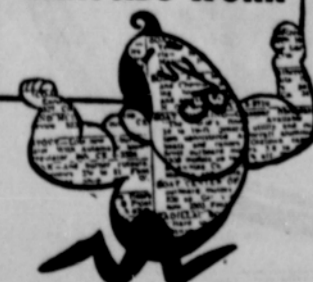

QUESTION: I am receiving social security benefits and still working. I expect to earn more than \$1200 this year but haven't reached that amount yet. Should I have my checks stopped now or should I wait until I have earned over \$1200 before notifying the social security office?

ANSWER: It would be better to have your checks stopped now, because if you wait until you have made over \$1200, you may have been considerably overpaid benefits before your checks can be stopped. Then you may have to make a refund after the money is spent, which may be very difficult for you.

QUESTION: I have been working in my sister's home about one month doing her housework and taking care of her children. She is unable to do the work herself because of recent surgery. I am being paid \$25 a week, which is all my sister can afford. Will she be required to report my pay for social security? Her husband says that she will, but I thought that work for relatives did not count for social security.

ANSWER: Your sister's husband is correct since the family employment exclusion does not apply in your situation. Domestic work for a son, daughter, or spouse, and work for a parent by a child under 21 does not count for social security credits, but this is the extent of the exclusion.

## Republicans of County Convene

The Columbia County Republican Central Committee meeting in St. Helens, Tuesday night, August 18, unanimously chose Leys McCarter of Warren as a candidate for Columbia County Port Commissioner in November. At the same time it also selected Irvin L. Gromachev of Scappoose as a candidate for county treasurer.

McCarter is presently employed by Crown Zellerbach and is well known throughout the county, having worked both in Vernonia and St. Helens. He was at one time employed by the county assessor's office. Gromachev is a former St. Johns businessman who retired and moved to Scappoose about five years ago.

A surprise feature of the evening meeting was the appearance of State Treasurer Howard Belton and Mrs. Belton. The state official discussed some of the financial angles of his office and answered many questions on state fiscal policy.

Concerning his candidacy for reelection, Belton said this was the 23rd time in 32 years his name had appeared on an Oregon ballot. He pointed out he has held many public offices, from school board to the house of representatives, to which he was elected in 1932, on to the state senate, where he served for 20 years. He was appointed state treasurer in January, 1960, and was elected to the position that fall.

Committee Chairman J. H. Clawson outlined plans for an active Republican campaign throughout the county this fall and indicated he would call another meeting of the group in September.

## Insect Control Tips Are Offered

If the summer has passed us by, apparently most of us missed it somewhere along the way. However, that doesn't seem to affect the insect pest and disease problems we will be confronted with this month according to Tom Zinn, Columbia county extension agent. The following insects, pests, and diseases, and their control are listed for your convenience.

CUTWORMS: In home yards this summer I have seen black, variegated and green cutworms working on all types of herbaceous foliage. This includes everything in the vegetable garden, primroses and all types of flowers. Most of the damage from these insect pests at this time of the year is from foliage feeding, and since most of them do their damage at night, dusts or sprays of the following insecticides should be applied in late evening Zinn points out. Materials which have proven effective against this insect pest include Malathion, DDT, and Toxaphene. Use according to manufacturer's directions on the label.

WESTERN SPOTTED CUCUMBER BEETLE: These are yellowish-green beetles with black spots. They are about one-quarter inch long, and the adults feed on flowers of many plants. Control measures include DDT, Malathion, Lindane, and Sevin.

EARWIGS: These dark brown insects have pinchers at the rear end and often feed in blossoms of dahlias, gladiolas and other flowering perennials in the garden. Control

measures should be applied as spot treatments where earwigs will contact the dust or spray. It is best to apply in late evening. Control measures include DDT, Malathion, Chlordane or earwig baits containing fish oil and sodium floussulfate, according to manufacturer's directions.

GRAPE POWDERY MILDEW: Powdery mildew can attack all parts of the grape plant, appearing in the early stages as whitish or grayish patches on the leaves and ultimately covering both surfaces when severe.

Later in the season, the mildew turns darker and becomes peppered with minute black dots. On the fruit, the fungus at first may appear grayish or whitish, but later it has a brownish russeted appearance. Infected fruit cracks and shells off badly.
