QUESTION: Can you send my social security check to me while I am in a foreign country?

ANSWER: In most cases, yes. However, there are certain restrictions that apply when you receive benefits outside the United States.

Get in touch with your local social security office for details. They can also give you a special post card on which to report your new address.

QUESTION: How soon should you check with the social security office before you retire?

ANSWER: Sixty to 90 days before retirement will generally provide enough time to best serve your needs.

QUESTION: A cousin of mine was killed last year. He wasn't married and the lump-sum death payment went to his brother because he paid the funeral bill. My cousin had been supporting his parents for years, but a friend said there was no need for them to visit the social security office because they're still in their fifties. Was that good advice?

ANSWER: No. While it's true that your cousin's dependent parents can't get benefit payments until they're 62, they must file evidence soon with social security to prove their dependency. This proof of dependency must be filed within two years of the date of your cousin's death. The social security people have the forms and will be glad to help your cousin's parents fill them out.
