## LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE OF ELECTION  
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT at the General Election to be held in the City of Vernonia, Oregon, on the 3rd day of November, 1964, all duly qualified and registered voters of the City of Vernonia may cast their ballots for or against the following measure:

ORDINANCE NO. 381  
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A BUILDING CODE FOR THE CITY OF VERNONIA AND ADOPTING THE 1961 UNIFORM BUILDING CODE.

THE CITY OF VERNONIA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:  
Section 1. The Uniform Building Code, 1961 Edition, as published by the International Conference of Building Officials, is hereby adopted as the Building Code of and for the City of Vernonia, Oregon, with the following amendments:

(A) Section 204 of said code is amended so as to provide for 3 members of the Board of Appeals rather than 5 members; and said section 204 is further amended by adding another sentence to the end thereof which shall say as follows: "A person who feels an injustice has been done him by an order or ruling of the building official or plumbing inspector may appeal therefrom to the Board of Appeals."

(B) That section 205 of the said Building Code shall be, and is, hereby amended to read as follows:

(1) Violation of a provision of this ordinance or amendments thereto is punishable, upon conviction, by:

(a) A fine of not more than \$100.00 for each day of violation where the offense is a continuing offense, but such fine shall not exceed \$1,000.00.  
(b) A fine of not more than \$500.00 where the offense is not a continuing offense.

(2) The erecting, construction, reconstruction, alteration, moving, or occupancy of a building or other structure in violation of this order or amendments thereto shall be deemed to be a nuisance.

(3) In case a building or other structure is proposed to be erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, moved or occupied in violation of this ordinance or amendments thereto, the City Attorney of Vernonia, Oregon or a person whose interest in real property in Columbia County is or may be affected by the violation, may, in addition to the remedies provided by law, institute proceedings for injunction, mandamus or abatement, or any other appropriate proceedings to prevent, temporarily or permanently enjoin, abate or remove the unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, moving, or occupancy.

(C) Table No. 3-A, forming a part of Section 303 of the aforementioned Building Code, herein adopted, shall be, and is, hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. That the said Building Code hereby adopted, shall be, and is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraphs:

(A) Building paper on the exterior of a dwelling shall not remain uncovered more than 18 months after a permit for constructing the building has been issued.

(B) Electric wiring shall comply with the requirements for electric wiring as they are now or hereafter prescribed by or pursuant to the laws of the State of Oregon.

(C) Plumbing, water supply, and sewage disposal facilities shall comply with the requirements for plumbing, water supply, and sewage disposal as they are now or hereafter prescribed by or pursuant to the laws of the State of Oregon.

(D) Where the conditions imposed by a provision of this order differ from the conditions of another provision of this order or of another law, or order having application in Vernonia, the provision which is more restrictive shall govern.

Section 3. That section 104 (b) of the building code herein adopted, shall be, and is, hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 104 (b) Additions, alterations, and repairs: More than 50 per cent. When additions, alterations, or repairs within any twelve month period exceed 50 per cent of the value of an existing building or structure, such building or structure shall be made to conform to the requirements for new buildings or structures EXCEPTING, however, dwelling buildings may be added to, altered or repaired without making the entire building or structure comply.

New construction shall conform to the requirements of this code for a new building of like area, height and occupancy. Such building or structures including any additions shall not exceed the areas and heights specified in this code.

Read the first time: December 11, 1962.

Read the second time by title only: December 11, 1962.

Read the third time and passed: December 17, 1962.

On September 1, 1964, the Commissioner accepted for filing an Application of Northwest Natural Gas Company submitted pursuant to the provisions of ORS Chapter 757. Said Applicant prays for an Order of the Commissioner allocating territory within which Applicant is exclusively providing gas utility service and certain adjacent unserved area as yet unserved by any other similar utility service. M.; thence easterly along and conforming to the Columbia River to the East Range line of R 14 E, W.M.; thence south to the North Township line of Township 1 S, W.M.; thence west to the East Range line of R 4 E, W.M.; thence south to the South Township line of Township 10 S, W.M.; thence west to the East Range line of R 1 E, W.M.; thence south to the South Township line of T 22 S, W.M.; thence west to the West Range line of R 6 W, W.M.; thence north to the North Township line of T 4 S, W.M.; thence east to the West Range line of R 4 W, W.M.; thence north to the North Township line of T 2 N, W.M.; thence east to the West Range line of R 2 W, W.M.; thence north to the South Township line of T 6 N, W.M.; thence east to the point of beginning.

### Adjacent Unserved Areas

Located in Benton, Clatsop, Columbia, Coos, Douglas, Lane, Lincoln, Polk, Tillamook, Washington and Yamhill Counties, commencing at the northwestern tip of the state of Oregon; thence east along the Columbia River to the intersection of the South Township line of T 6 N, W.M., with the Columbia River; thence west and south along the westerly boundary of the aforescribed exclusively served area to the North Township line of T 22 S, W.M.; thence westerly to the East Range line of R 12 W, W.M.; thence south to the South Township line of T 26 S, W.M.; thence west to the Pacific Ocean; thence north along the Oregon Coast to the point of beginning.
