CZ Mill Work Begins Monday

Construction on the new Crown Zellerbach paper mill at Wauna, began Monday, November 16.

The \$15 million plant will be constructed by Wright-Schuchart-Harbor Construction Co. of Seattle. CZ officials said, in announcing the bid award for the general contract. Terms of the contract call for work to be completed by June 30, 1965.

Work includes construction of the paper machine building, converting plant, steam boiler plant, storage shed, covered roadway to the wharf, sewer lines, underground utilities, paving and machine and mechanical installation.

Crown Zellerbach announced plans to construct the \$15 million mill for production of tissue paper grades at the site 28 miles east of Astoria earlier this year. The project will include a tissue machine with an annual capacity of 41,000 tons and a plant for converting this production into finished household paper products. The new mill will employ 100 persons.

Site preparation and excavation and rebuilding of dock facilities were completed earlier this fall.

Ag Census to Update Facts

The 1964 census of agriculture, now being conducted by the bureau of census, U. S. department of commerce, in Columbia county, will bring up to date the farm and ranch statistics last collected in 1959.

Here are a few of the many facts recorded in the 1959 agriculture census for this county:

There were 1,060 farms and ranches in 1959, compared with 1,773 in 1954. The average size of farm and ranch was 98.2 acres in 1959, compared with 75.4 acres in 1954.

The value of products sold by the county's farmers and ranchers in 1959 was \$4,839,403. The value of all crops sold was \$1,968,010. The value of all livestock and livestock products sold was \$2,871,473.

The 1964 national census of agriculture is the 18th in a series which began in 1840. Because of the rapid changes American agriculture has been undergoing in recent years, census bureau officials regard the current census as one of the most significant ever taken. They ask every farmer and rancher to cooperate in compiling an accurate record of these changes by filling out the census form he receives in the mail and holding the completed questionnaire until a census taker calls for it.

Sam Hearing Sr., who has the job here of assisting farmers in filling out the census forms, started work Wednesday contacting every farmer in the area. His work will be speeded up considerably if the forms are filled out as nearly as possible before he calls, according to R. L. Glogenser who is supervising the work in this county.

15 Permits Issued

The Columbia County Building Department reports that 15 permits were issued for the month of October at a valuation of \$90,375.00. This is below the October 1963 report which had a total of 29 permits issued at a valuation of \$115,845.00.
