Four County Projects Done

Completion of the Milton Creek bridge in St. Helens this month and the dedication last month of the Westport-Clatskanie section of US 30 represents the two major highway projects of the four completed this year in Columbia county at a cost of approximately \$4,376,000.

Forrest Cooper, state highway engineer, said the 8.87-mile Westport-Clatskanie section cost over \$4,200,000. The grading and paving project started November 9, 1962 and was dedicated November 3 by Governor Mark Hatfield. Most of the project is in Columbia county. Kuckenberg Construction company of Portland was the contractor.

The new bridge over Milton creek at the northwest city limits of St. Helens will have a 30-foot roadway with two five-foot sidewalks. Now almost completed, the reinforced concrete deck girder bridge replaces an old steel truss structure on the Pittsburg county road. The bridge cost is estimated at over \$36,000. E. F. Philpott of Tigard is the contractor.

Two other projects were completed earlier this year in Columbia county. One project was completed August 23 and involved paving 2.47 miles of the Pittsburg-Mile Bridge, south unit, and the Vernonia-Beaver creek sections of the Nehalem highway near Vernonia. The project also included rock production and cost over \$130,000. The contractor was Stevenson Rock Products company of Salem.

The other project was completed August 7 and involved grading and paving 0.07 mile of Nehalem street in Clatskanie. Cost of the project was \$10,500. St. Helens Paving company was the contractor.
