Notice is hereby given to all registered voters of the City of Vernonia that a public hearing will be held before the Common Council of the City of Vernonia on January 18, 1965, at 7:45 P.M. at the City Council Chambers in the City Hall, Vernonia, Oregon. All registered voters of the City of Vernonia may appear and be heard upon the question of annexation of the following described territory which is not in another city and is contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Vernonia, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the West line of the County Road which is North 89° 22' West 553.8 feet from the Southeast corner of the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 34, Township 5 North of Range 4 West of Willamette Meridian, Columbia County, Oregon; thence following the West line of said County Road North 17° 32' East 330.0 feet; thence North 89° 22' West 427.6 feet, more or less, to the center of the Nehalem River; thence up the center of the said stream, in a Southwesterly direction, to the South line of the said Northwest quarter of the said Section 34; thence following the said subdivision line South 89° 22' East 404.8 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

By Ordinance duly adopted by the Common Council of the City of Vernonia, the question of annexation shall not be submitted to the voters of the City of Vernonia; and said Ordinance further provides that after said hearing the City may submit the question of annexation to the registered voters of the territory proposed to be annexed under appropriate provisions of O.R.S. 222.120 and 222.170.

VanNatta Takes Legislative Job

Fred VanNatta has accepted the position of assistant to the majority leader in the Oregon House of Representatives, it was learned here this week. VanNatta, a 1956 graduate of Rainier high school returned from a position with the Republican party and the Scranton campaign in Pennsylvania to the job here in Oregon, which will include political research, speech writing and the preparation of news releases and newspaper articles for the Republican members of the house.

VanNatta, son of Mr. and Mrs. George VanNatta of the Apiary area, has been active in politics both in Columbia county and on the state level in Oregon. He originally went to Pennsylvania in connection with the masters degree in political science he received from the University of Oregon. He remained in Pennsylvania an extra year to work on the recent presidential campaign.

He has been visiting friends and relatives in the Columbia county area the past few weeks. He said of his new job, "The opportunity to work closely with the legislature will be a wonderful experience. The leadership of this session of the legislature is well organized and I think it will be a short, productive session."

VanNatta and his family will be living in Salem for the duration of the session.
