

Spray Circular Aids Gardener

Winter is planning time, not only for the commercial farmer, but also for the home gardener who would keep ahead of insects and diseases on his backyard fruit and nut trees next spring, summer and fall.

A newly-revised Oregon State University Extension circular, "Spray Schedule for Home Orchards," will help the backyard gardener plan now on steps to be taken during the coming months. The circular is available at county extension offices or from the OSU bulletin clerk, Corvallis.

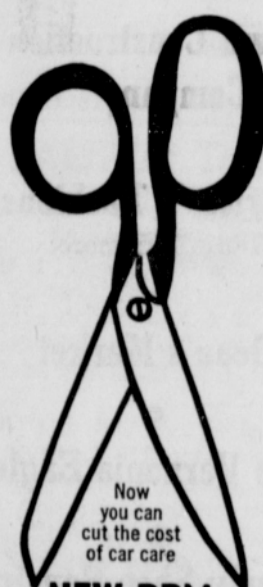
Written by Iain MacSwan, OSU extension plant pathologist, and R. W. Every, OSU extension entomologist, the circular outlines action to be taken to control insects and diseases which attack various fruit and nut trees.

The recommendations are made specifically for the home gardener and do not meet the requirements of the commercial orchardist.

The pesticides recommended were selected on the basis of their effectiveness, availability and safety, the authors point out. Most of the pesticides are among the less hazardous to the user and "all can be used safely if common sense precautions are observed," including following the manufacturer's directions, proper storage, and other safety precautions.

QUESTION: How do I get social security credit for my farm income? I had a net profit of about \$3000 last year, but I have enough dependents so I do not have to pay income tax.

ANSWER: Although you may not owe income tax, you must still file tax forms 1040 and Schedule F if your net income was \$400 or more. Your social security credit is based on the information reported on these forms.

QUESTION: I am a new bride and do not plan to retire from my job. What should I do about my social security card? My name is now different from the name on my card.

ANSWER: You should ask your social security office for a new card showing your new name. You will be asked to complete a short application and then will be issued a new card.

QUESTION: I recently opened a business and I hired two clerks. When do I start making the social security reports?

ANSWER: Your quarterly report must be made by the end of the month following the end of the quarter. Calendar quarters end on the last day of March, June, September, and December.

QUESTION: My 17-year-old daughter has been receiving social security benefits since her mother's death. She was married last week. Can she still receive her checks?

ANSWER: Your daughter cannot receive checks beginning with the month of her marriage. You should notify the social security office of her marriage, giving the exact date she was married.
