## 1965 Highway Map Published

The new 1965 official state highway map published by the Oregon State Highway Department is now available for public distribution, according to Forrest Cooper, state highway engineer.

The map is basically the same as last year's. It has a handy legend which explains the types of highways and the markings for parks, way sides, airports, and other points of interest.

Lincoln City appears on the map for the first time. It incorporates Oceanlake, Delake, Nelscott, Taft, and Cutler City. Also on the map for the first time are ORE138 (North Umpqua Highway), a paved highway that connects Interstate 5 and US97 between Roseburg and a point east of Crater Lake; ORE126 (old Route F) from Eugene to Mapleton; and the paved Lake of the Woods Highway from Eagle Point north of Medford to Klamath Falls.
