Each shearing school is limited to sixteen persons. Participants will shear a number of animals and will gain sufficient knowledge and skill to qualify them to shear their own flock.

Enrollment applications can be secured from the county extension office, in the courthouse, at St. Helens. They are due in Corvallis by March 1.

Applications are now being sent to high schools throughout Oregon for the second annual ICOA Life Insurance Frank Leahy Football Scholarship Award.

According to ICOA President Reginald Jensen, the scholarship is awarded to a graduating Oregon highschool senior on the basis of outstanding ability in football, scholastic achievement, and character. Judging the competition is a panel composed of Oregon sports writers and broadcasters. Chairman of this year's panel of judges is Johnny Carpenter, Sports Director at KOIN TV. The scholarship alternates each year between the University of Oregon and Oregon State University and carries with it a \$6000 grant, which is administred by the University, for a full tuition four year scholarship.

Application blanks are sent to every high school in the state. Each school selects a candidate for presentation to the panel of judges. The judges study all the applications received and choose five finalists. Each of the five finalists is given a personal interview with the judging panel and it is on the basis of these interviews and the candidates record of achievement that the scholarship winner is chosen.

ICOA was motivated to award this \$6000 annual scholarship to encourage top Oregon high school athletes to remain in the state and attend Oregon universities.

Last year's winner, Dick Jones of Pendleton, is presently attending the University of Oregon. This year's scholarship will go to Oregon State University.




