Rites Held for Mrs. Horsley

Mrs. Nancy Horsley, who for the past five years had been making her home with her son on route 1, Cornelius, and her daughter at Verboort, passed away December 18 at the Forest Grove Community hospital following a brief illness just four days prior to her 84th birthday.

Funeral services were conducted at the Fuiten-Friesen Mortuary Chapel, Vernonia, Tuesday, December 21 at 1:30 p.m.

Rev. Cletus Freeman, Assembly of God Minister of Hillsboro, officiated at the services with Mrs. Frank Serafin as soloist and Mrs. Lloyd Thomas, organist. Concluding rites and interment were at the Vernonia Memorial cemetery with Charles Kelly, Ernest Herman, Walt Parker, Mark Forrest, Bill Horn and Wally Noakes serving as casket bearers.

Mrs. Horsley was born December 22, 1881 at Harrison, Arkansas and spent all of her early years in that area. She was united in marriage there to William Horsley in 1909 and they continued to reside in that area until coming to the West Coast in 1941 and to Vernonia in 1942. She made her home in Vernonia for almost 20 years, living in the Capitol Hill district until the last few years when she had been living with her children in Washington county. Mr. Horsley preceded her in death in October, 1950.

Surviving are six children: four sons, Tom and Pat Horsley, both of Twin Falls, Idaho; John Horsley, Hanford, California and Los Horsley of Cornelius; and two daughters, Mrs. E. A. (Geneva) Rice, Verboort and Mrs. John (Kate) Harley, Toppenish, Washington. Also surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Mary Smith and Mrs. Hattie Ivey, both of California; 29 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren.
