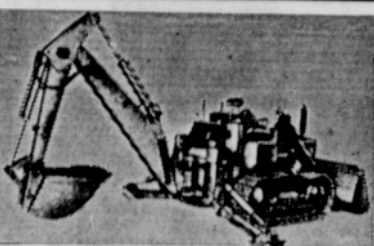

QUESTION: I began receiving my retirement benefits at 62 and when I was age 63 I became disabled. I checked at my social security office and they told me that I could not get disability benefits because I was receiving retirement benefits. Has this been changed by the 1965 amendments?

ANSWER: Yes. After receiving retirement benefits, it is now possible to change to disability benefits if you become disabled before 65. This means that if you are already receiving a reduced benefit when you become disabled, your payments may be increased.

QUESTION: What benefits are payable under hospital insurance?

ANSWER: Up to 90 days of hospital care are provided for each spell of illness. You pay the first \$40 and \$10 daily after 60 days of hospitalization. You are also eligible for out-patient diagnostic services, post-hospital home health services and effective January 1, 1967, post-hospital extended care.

QUESTION: I have read that my monthly widow's benefits, if started at 60, will be reduced. Will you explain this please?

ANSWER: Any widow who files when she is 60 or 61 will have her monthly benefit reduced according to the number of months she will receive benefits before 62. This reduction will be permanent.

QUESTION: My aunt is 78 and has never worked under social security. Is there any way she can get coverage under Medicare?

ANSWER: Yes. With few exceptions, everyone who will reach 65 before 1968 will be covered by the Medicare Law. Since your aunt is not receiving social security benefits, however, she needs to apply

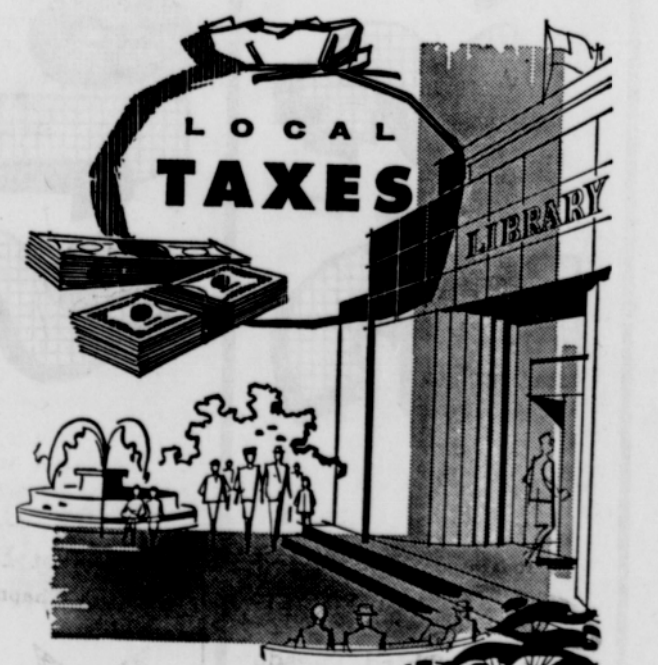
