Assembly Dated For Witnesses

Wayne Hathaway, presiding minister of the Vernonia Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses announced a few days ago that all of the activity of the congregation, including public meetings, will be suspended between the dates of January 21 and 23, thus allowing each member of the congregation to attend the "Increasing Our Praise to Jehovah" assembly to be held in the R. A. Long high school in Longview, Washington.

The local congregation will join an anticipated 1,000 Witnesses of Jehovah in the auditorium for the three-day program of Bible discussion. The Longview assembly will be the first of three scheduled by Jehovah's Witnesses this year and will represent 17 congregations in Oregon and Washington.


