
Couple Attends Bureau Meeting

Mathews Hear Dale Sanders




Witnesses Home **After Seminar**

Jehovah's Witnesses of the Vernonia congregation returned home this week from a Bible conference in Longview, Washington. The convention ended Sunday with a peak attendance of 978.

The high attendance was reached at the climax of the three-day seminar at the public lecture, "What Does the Resurrection From the Dead Mean to You and Yours?" given by Alvyn L. Franck, district official from the World Headquarters of Jehovah's Witnesses in Brooklyn, New York. Mr. Franck was quoted as saying, "The Bible is unique in that it is the only sacred book in existence that teaches a resurrection of the dead. The teachings of immortality of the human soul and resurrection contradict each other. Since one of them must be false it is the immortality of the human soul teaching that finds no basis in the scripture but is rooted in paganism. The Bible teaches resurrection of the dead."

Another highlight of the conference was the baptism and ordination service at which 15 ministers were added to the world wide Bible teaching fellowship.






