Guests Attend Rebekah Meet



Bank Offers Savings Plan

U. S. National Bank of Oregon instituted a new savings program designed to yield a higher rate of interest on Monday, February 7, according to President E. J. Kolar.

In an effort to stimulate more savings in the state of Oregon, which in turn provides an increased lending capacity, Kolar said U. S. National's 101 statewide offices will offer "Thrift Certificates."

Size of the new certificates will range from a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of \$25,000. Maturity will be from 90 days to 12 months, and the certificates will offer a higher rate of return than a passbook savings account.

A Thrift Certificate with a 12month maturity date will return 4.5 percent to its owner. A certificate with a maturity date of at least 180 days but less than 12 months will return 4.25 percent and a certificate with a maturity date of 90 days to 179 days will yield 4.0 percent. To achieve this new higher rate of interest, each certificate is redeemable only upon maturity.
