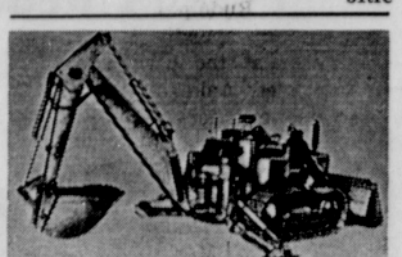

Students Enter Essay Contest

An essay contest to promote student interest in civic participation has been announced by Rep. Wendell Wyatt (R-Ore.).

Junior and senior high school students living in the 1st Congressional district have been invited to submit essays on the topic of "My Role in the Future of the United States." First place winner will receive a \$50 U. S. savings bond, second place winner a \$25 bond, and the top two essays will be entered in the Congressional Record. Third, fourth and fifth place winners will receive large American flags which have flown over the Capitol in Washington, D. C.

Participating schools have been asked to send their five best essays to be judged by a panel of judges. Deadline for submitting entries to Rep. Wyatt's district office in Milwaukie is April 12.

In announcing the contest, Rep. Wyatt stated, "I feel that young people about to enter full citizenship should examine carefully the nature of a representative democracy and consider the role they will play in our country's future. I hope that this contest will serve to emphasize the importance of active civic participation by informed citizens."

Mrs. Alvilda Hearing, English teacher at Vernonia high school, stated this week that several local students will enter essays in the contest.
