**Rites Set for Dave Jackson**

Dave Jackson, 86 year old retired farmer who had been a resident of the Forest Grove and Buxton communities for the past 33 years, passed away at a Woodburn Nursing home February 27 following an extended illness.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Fuiten-Friesen Mortuary Chapel, Forest Grove, Thursday, March 3 at 1:30 p.m.

The Rev. Tom Hilson, pastor of the Cornelius Methodist church will officiate at the services with Dave Fuiten as soloist and Mrs. Richard Bunker, organist. Concluding committal rites will be at the Mt. View Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Jackson was a native of Croley Ridge, Arkansas where he was born June 6, 1879. When he was a young boy he moved with his family to West Texas and then as a young man he went to the Oklahoma Territory. He was united in marriage to Ite Martin at Ardmore in the Indian Territory in 1909. She preceded him in death in 1933. That year he came to Oregon and had been a resident of this area since. He first spent a number of years in the Forest Grove area and then later had a farm between Buxton and Vernonia where he farmed until his retirement. In recent years he had made his home in Buxton. He had been a lifelong member of the Methodist church.

Surviving are six children: two sons, Martin Jackson of Buxton; Calvin Jackson, Salem; and four daughters, Mrs. Elmer (Bessie) Stewart, Bethany; Mrs. Fred (Minnie) Dusek, Vernonia; Mrs. Gregory (Ollie) Benton, Vallejo, California and Mrs. Howard (Louise) Bogue, Gardena, California.

Also surviving is a sister, Mrs. Alicia Haney, Gainsville, Texas; 25 grandchildren, 52 great grandchildren and six great-great grandchildren. Another daughter, Mrs. Willie Mae Ridding preceded him in death here in October 1964.
