Law Bars Pets From Markets

Buster, Rover, Gyp, Prince—they all may be well behaved dogs and just like members of the family, but the Oregon Department of Agriculture says the one place they must not go with the family is into the grocery store.

It's not just that some people who do not have pets are fussy about having them around food they plan to purchase, but the fact that under inspections of the grocery stores made by the department pets are not allowed in food markets.

Joe Gray, assistant chief in the dairy and consumer services division for foods, says the department has received some complaints from persons who have seen dogs in stores.

He points out that not even a small dog being carried in the arms or in a basket is permitted in food markets.

The department is also on the alert for any produce outside the store that is sitting on the ground, for under sanitation requirements it must be high enough that it cannot be contaminated by animals.

Richard L. Yost, society president, said an estimated 480,000 Oregon residents will receive Easter Seals in the mail during the next few days and he expressed hope that "they will respond as generously as they can."

Yost pointed out that the Easter Seal society assists "only those physically handicapped persons who cannot qualify for aid from any other organization, either public or private."
