### Lenten Meditation

The Apostle Paul expressed in a pointed way a concern or ambition that should interest any serious minded person who is at all concerned with spiritual thought when he said "That I may know Him and the power of His resurrection" in Phillipians, the third chapter and the tenth verse.

This expresses an important part of the purpose for which he says, "He has suffered the loss of all things." (Paul speaks here of Christ). "That he may know Him and the power of His resurrection."

Christ spoke of this power as recorded in John, the tenth chapter, the 17th and 18th verses, where He said: "Therefore doth my Father love me because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself, I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again."

Christ speaks again of this power, and challenges our faith as he did that of Martha, as recorded in John, chapter 11, verse 25, where He says: "I am the resurrection and the life, he that believeth in me, though he die, yet shall he live".

This statement shows us why Paul was so concerned to know Christ and the power of His resurrection, for Christ by this statement, makes this power available in behalf of those who will believe in Him.

May we too, earnestly seek to know Him and the power of His resurrection.
