Bank Records Deposit Gains

An increase in deposits of 8.4 percent and an increase in loans of 12.7 percent over the call date of April 26, 1965 were reported by U.S. National Bank of Oregon on the April 5 call date to James J. Saxon, U.S. comptroller of the currency.

E. J. Kolar, U.S. National Bank president, reported that deposits totaled \$1,177,030,867 on that date, an increase of \$90,869,851. Loans were \$721,329,775, an increase of \$81,709,230, over the \$639,620,546 figure last year.

The Vernonia branch of U.S. National recorded total deposits of \$1,832,380.08 according to B. R. Pilger, manager. Loans for the local branch stood at \$397,547.19.

The statewide financial institution's total resources and capital funds also increased. Total resources on April 5, 1966 were \$1,291,629,150., an increase of \$84,532,239., and capital increased \$1,531,142 to a new high of \$91,904,292.

Earlier Kolar had revealed that U.S. National's net operating earnings after taxes for the first quarter of 1966 totaled \$1,911,691., an increase of 15.1 percent over the first quarter of 1965.

Robert W. Straub, state treasurer and Democratic primary candidate for governor, will be the featured speaker at a no-host dinner sponsored by the Columbia County Democratic Central committee to be held in St. Helens, on Saturday, April 30. The dinner will be held at the Village Inn and will start at 6:30 p.m.

Malcolm Cross of Beaverton and George Haines of Astoria, the two Democratic primary candidates for United States Representative from the first district, will also be on the program. Ticket prices are set at \$2.50 per plate and may be purchased at the door. Franciene Urban, chairman of the Democratic Central committee, invites the public to hear and to meet these candidates at this dinner.

Straub was elected state treasurer in 1964 and since then has been recognized as a leading Democratic vote-getter in the state. He is a veteran of World War II, holds a master's degree from Dartmouth and he and his wife, Pat, are the parents of six children ranging in age from 11 to 21 years. Straub's public service in addition to his current position as state treasurer includes four years as Lane county commissioner from 1954-58 and state senator from Lane county from 1958-62.
