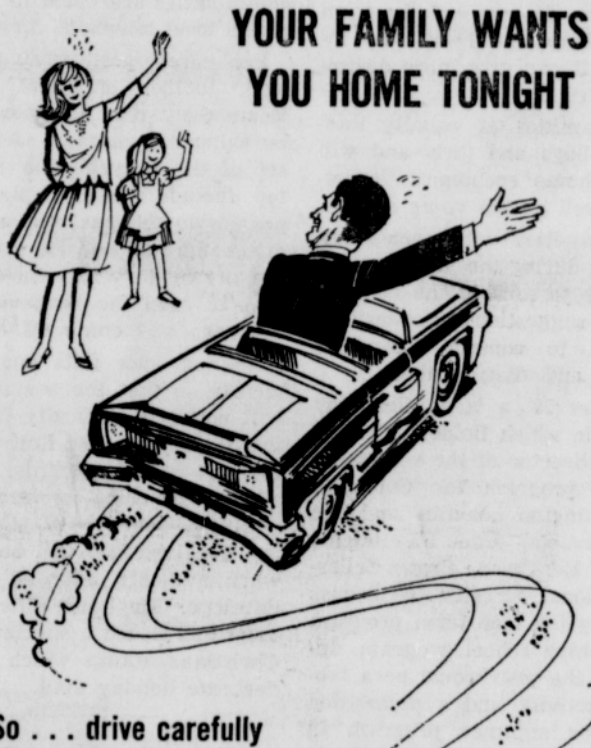
Vincent Monaco was taken to the Forest Grove hospital Tuesday for tests.

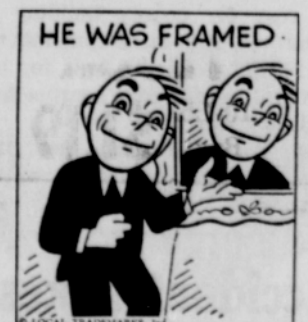
Junior Scout Troop Sets Caroling Date
