PCC Auto Repair Is Family Affair

Like father, like son... like son... like son. Robert Seaman and three of his five sons are students in Portland Community College's Auto Body Repair program. Seaman, a butcher for 15 years, decided to enter the auto repair program after he was laid-off last summer. He entered the program in September, son Rick, 21, began his first term in January, and Spring term, Ron, 18, and Bob, 16, registered for classes. All agree that their reason for entering the program was that they "like cars and working with their hands."

After the Seamans complete the three-term PCC program, they will serve an apprenticeship in different auto repair shops. Then they hope to start their own shop with Rick specializing in custom work. It will be strictly a family affair with Mrs. Seaman and a sister handling the secretarial-bookkeeping duties.

Auto repair classes are taught at PCC's Cascade Transportation and Technology Center, 5131 N.E. Union, Portland. During the first term a student learns gas welding, paint preparation, and how to align fenders, hoods and grills, radiator shells, etc. In the second term he demonstrates metal finishing and shrinking of metals, use and application of plastics, and estimating damage. During the third and final term, the student specializes in alignment of body, replacing turret tops and body panels, and is introduced to arc welding. A two-year associate degree is being developed. Students work on actual wrecked vehicles during the laboratory class period.



QUESTION: I will be 18 in November. Will my social security checks stop then?

ANSWER: It will depend on whether you will be a full-time student or if you are disabled. A child's benefits automatically end with the payment for the month before the month in which he attains 18 unless he is a full-time student or he qualifies for childhood disability benefits.

QUESTION: I became disabled at 27 and recently heard that I need less credit of work than those 31 or older to be eligible for monthly benefits. Is this correct?

ANSWER: Yes. You only need credit for having worked half the time between 21 and the time you became disabled.

QUESTION: I signed up for Medicare about 30 days ago. I have not received my Medicare card and I have to go to the hospital shortly. What should I do?

permits, you could be issued a temporary letter of eligibility by your local social security office. If this is not possible, when you check into the hospital, just tell them at the admission office that you have signed up for Medicare. The hospital will check with social security to verify that you are eligible.
