

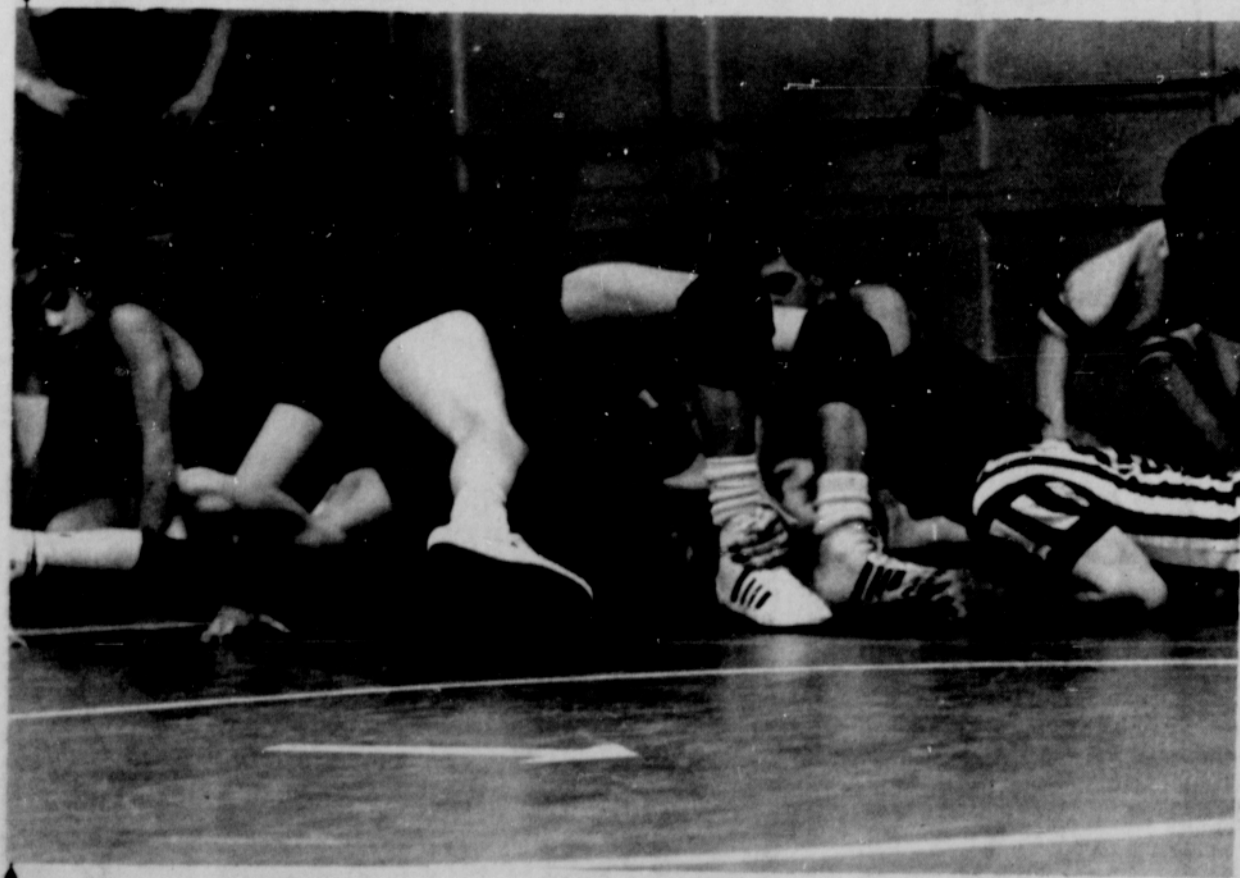

Boat Show Sets Opening Jan. 13

The 13th annual Portland Boat, Trailer and Sport Show will open at 2 p.m., Saturday, Jan. 13, in the Memorial Coliseum with river running lore, free fishing for youngsters and pitching tips from a 4200-game winner on its for-all-the-family program.

All aspects of healthful outdoor recreation, camping through water skiing, have places in the three acres of exhibits and demonstrations occupying the total coliseum complex.

More than 300 boats of all types, power, paddle and sail, and nearly 150 vacation trailers and other recreational vehicles will occupy the bulk of the exhibit area. Mixed between the "big ticket" boats and trailers will be exhibits and displays tuned to fishing, hunting and a dozen other outdoor fun pursuits.

Travel planners will find the major vacation resorts of the Northwest represented in displays of state and provincial tourist promotion departments including Alaska, Montana, and British Columbia.

The free fish pond open to youngsters ten and under has been stocked with thousands of pan-sized rainbow trout.

The pitching tips will come from Eddie Feigner Sr., the "King" of the famous four-man softball team "The King and His Court." He has a lifetime professional strike out record of 84,438, including 16,238 when he was pitching blindfolded.

The show will open at 2 p.m. daily throughout its nine day run.

Cutter to Be Shown at Boat Show January 13

Of interest to boat show enthusiasts will be the exhibit of the Cutter for the first time in the Pacific Northwest. This unique craft, though known in the San Francisco and Los Angeles area for the past several years, was introduced last spring in the Puget Sound area by Normandy Northwest, a Seattle-based firm.

The 28-foot, fiberglass boat is trailerable and is known as a houseboat in a cruiser hull. Lloyd Ennor of Normandy Northwest will be at the boat show which opens Saturday, January 13, at the Memorial Coliseum in Portland to answer questions.
