

112 Acres Burned In CZ Forest Fire

Approximately 112 acres were burned in the forest fire that raged at Crawford Ridge near Jewell last week. The holocaust was fought by 140 men, working two shifts until the fire was contained Wednesday afternoon. Eight acres of felled timber and seven acres of green timber were destroyed in the flames with another 97 acres of cutover slash, which had already been replanted by the state, burned. Although the fire is out, Crown Zellerbach officials reported that "hot spots" were still showing up in the area.
