PCC Sponsored Classes Start Next Week

The Community Education classes sponsored by Portland Community College beginning here next week, offer a wide variety of subjects from which to choose.

Included are a number of classes to be taught by volunteer teachers for which only a nominal fee will be charged.

Class subjects include special interest courses in Amateur Ham Radio, Drying Foods for Backpacking and Home Use, Beginning Folk Guitar, Hunter Safety, Stocks and Bonds and a Stop-Smoking Clinic.

In the area of recreation, classes will be held in Polynesian Dance, Slim and Trim and a weekly bus trip to the swimming pool in Forest Grove on Tuesday evenings, for all ages. A bowling class will also be announced later, after the bowling league schedule has been arranged.

The field of arts and crafts will include a comprehensive course in candlemaking and a continuation of the oil painting class, which is designed for beginners as well as painters with some previous experience. Applied arts classes will include Landscaping and Small Appliance Repair for Men and Women.

Women interested in developing homemaking skills will be offered classes in Garment Construction, Sewing Men's Knit Slacks, and Sewing Men's Sport Coats.

A business course in Multi-Level Typing is being presented for beginners or those wishing to brush-up or increase their skill in typing.

It is planned as the first of a series of business courses to prepare beginners in office and business skills or as refresher courses for those wishing to brush-up on these subjects preparatory to re-entry into the business world.

The GED classes to assist persons, over school-age to obtain a high school diploma will also continue in the PCC van located on Mondays at the Lincoln Savings and Loan location on Bridge Street.

Colonel Kuge received a battlefield commission in 1945 while serving with the 442nd.

Garment Construction Class Set For Tuesday

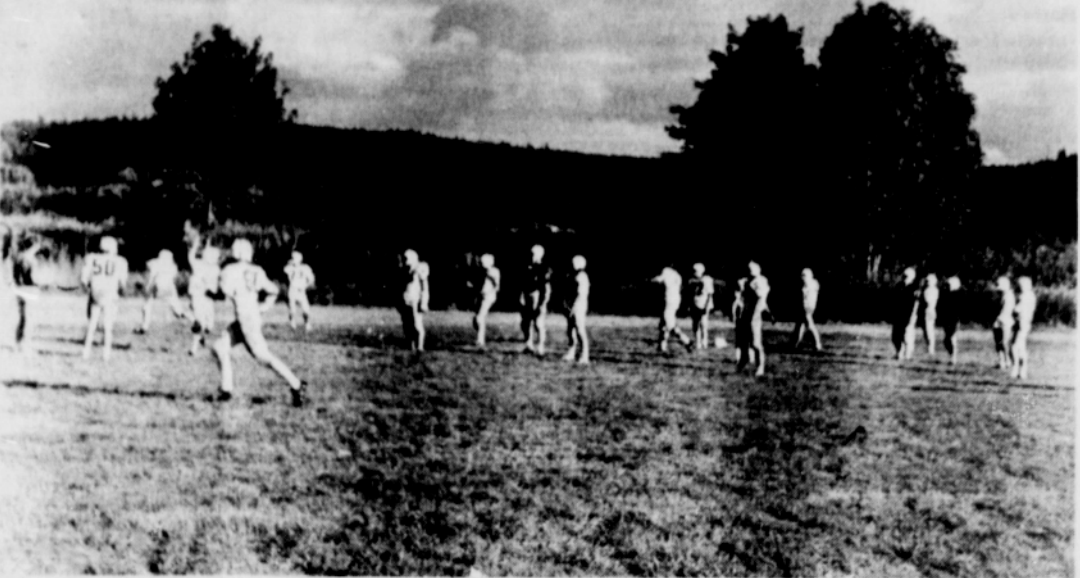
The Basic Garment Construction class, beginning Tuesday night next week, will teach the basic techniques of constructing a garment plus the actual pattern designing and cutting.

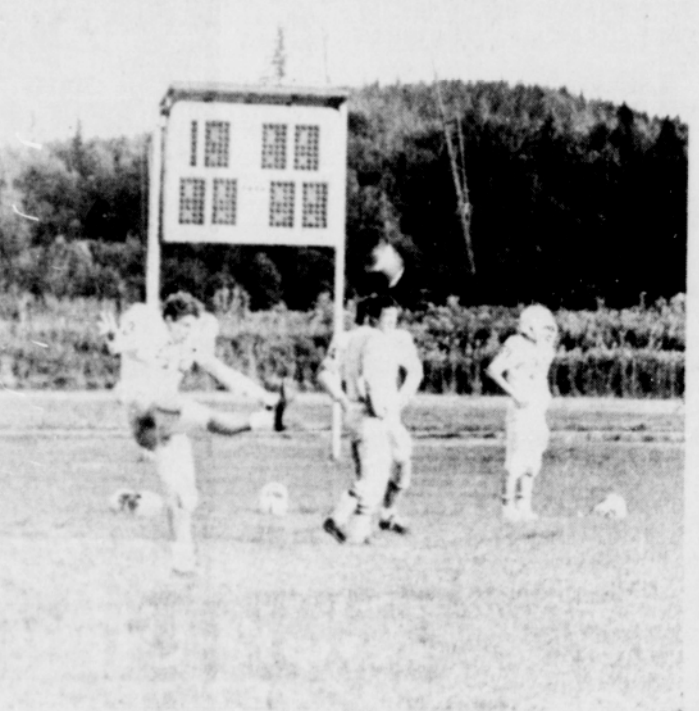
