**Motorists Warned Not To Mix Tires**  
Oregon motorists have been cautioned against mixing radial ply tires with non-radial tires when purchasing new snow treads this winter.

The word of caution came from the Oregon Motor Vehicles Division which noted that with the increased use of radial tires in recent years, many motorists have unmatched sets of radial tires with non-radial tires. This results in a potentially dangerous situation because of distinctive handling capabilities of the different types of tire construction.

To be on the safe side, DMV suggests drivers follow this advice:

1. Follow the recommendation of the auto manufacturer in the owner's manual or a reputable tire service store or dealer.

2. If your car is equipped with radial ply tires, it is essential that radial ply constructed snow treads be purchased. Radial ply tires should never be mixed with bias or belted-bias constructed tires.
