Evangelical **Church Will** Hear Rev.

The Rev. Clifford Good, missionary under appointment to Taiwan, will speak at the Vernonia Evangelical Church, Sunday, December 2, at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Mr. and Mrs. Good are under appointment by World Gospel Mission, an interdenominational organization with approximately 240 missionaries and associate missionaries in 15 areas around the world, with headquarters in Marion Indiana.

Cliff has had a life-long association with World Gospel Mission since his father has for many years served on WGM's homeland staff, with the present title of Vice President in charge of Business Administration. While a sophomore in high school, Cliff was saved during a revival campaign in his home church in Marion, Indiana.

Cliff attended Cascade College, Portland, Oregon, for three years and then graduated from George Fox College, Newberg, Oregon. An athlete in high school and college, he enjoyed the privilege in 1969 of being a member of a Christian basketball team which toured Latin America. While attending Westr n Evangelical Seminary, Portland, where he received a B.D. degree, Cliff learned the secret of total surrender to God and experienced the infilling of the Holy Spirit. During his seminary years, he served as youth director and assistant pastor at Lents Evangelical Church in Portland.

Less than one month before Cliff was born, and in the same hospital in Portland, Charlene Wildermuth began her life. When she was four, her family went to Japan to serve with Oriental Missionary Society. At present her father is Personnel Director at OMS headquarters, Greenwood, Indiana.
