Names of 1,500 students have been announced as 1974 Oregon Scholars by the State Scholarship Commission.

Students earning this honor are selected from all high schools in Oregon on the basis of their outstanding academic achievement. The students from this area selected as Oregon Scholars is Chris Collins.

The purpose of the Oregon Scholars award is to give recognition to the academic attainments of students who have excelled in high school, whether or not they have financial need which qualified them for state scholarships.

The group chosen as Oregon Scholars was selected from the 1974 graduating classes of Oregon high schools totaling approximately 35,000.

Each recipient will be presented with an Oregon Scholar certificate by the Commission. In addition, Gov. Tom McCall has sent a letter of tribute to the Oregon Scholars of each high school. Most high schools also will incorporate Oregon Scholar award presentations into their graduation ceremonies.
