Notice is hereby given that the Oregon State Land Board, acting through the Division of State Lands, will receive sealed bids at its office in Salem, Oregon, up to 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, August 6, 1974, to be opened and read at that hour, for a lease for houseboat, boat house, small boat marina, boat repair and sales purposes, of a tract in the bed of the Multnomah Channel as more particularly described hereinafter, giving to the owner or owners of upland fronting and abutting thereon the preference right to accept the lease at the highest bid as set out in ORS 274.040; the Land Board reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

Said Multnomah Channel tract is described as follows: Beginning at a point of intersection of the East line of Lot 2, Section 19, Township 3 North, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Columbia County, Oregon, with the centerline of dike at a point which is South 63° 43' East 2776.13 feet from the Northeast corner of the T. 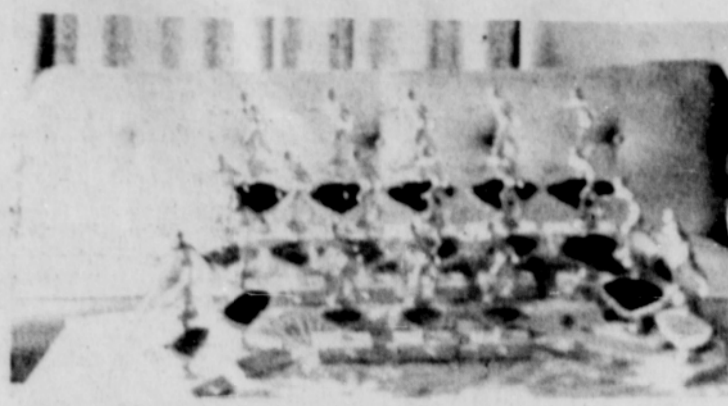

Oregon Receives Grant For Volunteer Program

Oregon has been awarded a \$174,000 grant from ACTION to establish a State Volunteer Services and City County Regional Volunteer Program, according to Michael P. Balzano, Director of ACTION.

PSU Offers Oregon Tours

Looking for an inexpensive way to see Oregon this summer? You might want to check out a non-credit summer program entitled "Oregon on \$5 a day", which is sponsored by educational activities at Portland State University.

The program is open to the public and involves touring Oregon by canoe, bus, boat, and foot.

Trips are planned during July and early August to vacation spots throughout northwest Oregon. Generally, there is either a \$5 fee for participating or a canoe rental fee, but no trip costs more than \$5 a day.

The next trip planned is a bus tour showing spots of historical significance in the Willamette Valley including Portland, Oregon City, Aurora and Champego. This is scheduled for Friday, July 12 and costs \$5.

The schedule for the rest of the program looks like this: Sunday, July 14, a guided canoe trip of the Portland Harbor; Friday through Sunday, July 19-21, a boat trip with two overnight stays on the lower Columbia River; Friday through Sunday, July 19-21; a guided canoe trip from Independence to Portland; Friday, July 26, a bus tour of the Oregon coast tide pools in the Newport area; Sunday, July 28, a guided canoe trip to Ross Island; Friday, Aug. 2, a bus tour and hike of the Alpine meadows of Cloud Cap Inn; Sunday, Aug. 4, a guided canoe trip to Sauvie Island; and Saturday through Sunday, Aug. 10-11, a boat trip with one overnight stay to the Cascade Locks.
