Notice is hereby given that the Oregon State Land Board, acting through the Division of State Lands, will receive sealed bids at its office in Salem, Oregon, up to 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, August 6, 1974, to be opened and read at that hour, for a lease for houseboat, boat house, small boat marina, boat repair and sales purposes, of a tract in the bed of the Multnomah Channel as more particularly described hereinafter, giving to the owner or owners of upland fronting and abutting thereon the preference right to accept the lease at the highest bid as set out in ORS 274.040; the Land Board reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

Said Multnomah Channel tract is described as follows:

Beginning at a point of intersection of the East line of Lot 2, Section 19, Township 3 North, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Columbia County, Oregon, with the centerline of dike at a point which is South 63° 43' East 2776.13 feet from the Northeast corner of the T. J. Handle With Care; Soft Shell Crabs Hard At Work

Pulling a leg is no joking matter when it comes to dealing with a Dungeness crab. This popular sport and commercial crab moves into shallow water each year to recover from the process of shedding its old shell. During this time the crabs have a very soft shell and are vulnerable to mishandling and rough raking by crabbers.

Soft-shelled crabs are also rather poor in meat quality. The meat is gelatinous, watery and does not fill the new shell. A hard-shelled crab will yield 25-30 percent meat while a soft-shelled crab will yield only 10-15 percent. It is therefore naturally desirable to waylay the hard crabs while leaving the soft crabs to mature for greater meat quantity and quality.

The Fish Commission of Oregon requires no license to take Dungeness crab for personal use. A little care is required, however, so that all soft, undersized, or female crabs are returned to the water without injury. Twelve male crabs may be taken per day per person with

no more than 24 taken in 7 consecutive days. The crabs must be at least 5 1/4 inches across and widest part of the back, exclusive of spines. Soft and hard-shelled crabs are generally found in the same areas so a good rule of thumb for this time of the season is to handle the crabs gently and rake slowly in order to minimize injuries. To determine shell texture, pick the crab up gingerly from center rear to avoid its powerful pincers. Simply pinch the large section of a rear leg. A hard crab's leg is easily flattened. For a Dungeness crab a good leg pulling is indeed no joking matter. The Fish Commission of Oregon reminds you to pinch that leg but go easy on our friends who have it soft!

CZ Reports Six Months Record Set

Crown Zellerbach has reported that sales and earnings in the second quarter and first six months of 1974 set new records. Second quarter sales of \$430,151,000 were 20 percent ahead of the comparable 1973 period, while net income of \$32,622,000 represented more than a 10 percent improvement. Earnings per share were \$1.32, compared with \$1.20, restated to reflect acquisitions.

For the six months, sales were \$818,299,000, 17 percent ahead of the prior year. Net income was \$59,877,000, or \$2.43 a share, a 10 percent improvement over last year's \$54,549,000, or \$2.21.

President C.R. Dahl said that the earnings improvements were achieved despite a softening in worldwide demand for wood products, which adversely affected earnings contributions from both domestic and international operations. He noted that the company's earnings have improved on a quarter-to-quarter comparison basis for nine consecutive quarters but added that costs have been increasing at a greater rate than price increases.

Mr. Dahl said the outlook is for continuing strong market demand in the company's paper, packaging and wholesale distribution businesses. "Timber and wood products remain at a reasonably good level, although below the record prices reached in the first half of last year," he added.

Mr. Dahl said the company expects that lower earnings contributions from timber and wood products will continue to be more than offset by improvements in other major areas of the business. On that basis, 1974 results should exceed the record set last year.
