CAUTION!

CHAPTER 179, SECTIN 3.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to sell, offer or expose for sale, any short weight butter in the State of Oregon. All butter sold or exposed or offered in rolls, prints or squares within the State of Oregon, shall be plainly marked: 'Eight ounces, full weight,' sixteen ounces, full weight, 'twenty-four ounces, full weight,' or 'thirty-two ounces, full weight,' and ever roll, print or square sold, offered or exposed for sale shall contain the number of ounces marked thereon and any person, firm, association or corporation violating any provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in county jail for not less than six months; or both such fine and imprisonment.

Work Commenced on Irrigation Project

Work was commenced this week on the supply ditch for the Antelope reservoir. This irrigation project will ultimately consist of reservoirs that will be capable of storing 239,000 acre feet of water and has a sufficient water supply to more than fill these immense storage reservoirs from the flood waters in the spring. The construction of the larger and upper storage reservoir will be done as soon as the settlement of the lands and demand for more water will justify, and the work will be kept ahead of the demand so that there will be ample water for all who may settle on the lands under this project.

The lands covered by this irrigation project are of the richest and most productive in the West, and as the entire project can be constructed at a very reasonable cost per acre it can be put on the market at a much lower price per acre than any other irrigation project in the United States.—Jordan Valley Express.

HIGHBROWS SAY THERE'S WEALTH IN SAGEBRUSH

Owners of Nyssa Dry Lands
May Be Modern Monte
Christos.

A San Francisco press dispatch quoting from a prominent resident of that city says:

"I have secured some chemical investigation of the properties of sagebrush, and such men as Professor Sparling of the Northwestern University of Chicago, Professor James E. Tammage of Salt Lake and Professors Jacobson and Dinsmore of the State University unite in the declaration that a ton of sagebrush contains more than \$23 worth of staple chemical products, charcoal, distillate, alcohol, creosote, etc., which can be extracted at a cost of \$3 a ton.

"A railroad is selling land at \$5 an acre and inviting farmers to come in and clear the land for alfalfa. The land already has 25 tons of sagebrush an acre, and can be handled at a clear profit of \$20 of ton. Thus every acre of sagebrush is worth \$500. The sagebrush is worth more than the alfalfa; yet the settlers pay \$3 an acre to clear it up and burn the sagebrush instead of extracting the values.

"The sagebrush is worth more than all the mines in the west and will pay a profit of more than 500 per cent on the investment. Yet no one tackles it, for capitalists prefer to invest in sugar beet factories that pay 6 per cent a year, when the crops are good. The sagebrush crop is sure, and after you clear the land of it is fully replenished in seven years without any replanting, cultivation or irrigation.

"Congressman Baker has taken hold of the chemists' reports and is bringing the matter to the attention of Congress. Eastern capital already is investigating the matter with a view of starting dry distillation plants in Nevada and California.

"In Michigan, millions are invested in the dry distillation of hard woods. They pay \$5 a cord for the wood and make money. Here they ought to do fairly well when they get the raw material for nothing."
