SEC. LANE SAYS EASTERN OREGON HAS BIG FUTURE

Will Be One of Richest, Most Fertile and Thickly Settled Parts of State.

Secretary of the Interior Lane passed through Nyssa yesterday on his way from Portland to Boise. At Portland Secretary Lane spent some time looking after the needs of the state. At a banquet he made an address which in part was as follows:

"Sometimes a doubt may creep into our minds when we see what we believe to be grave mistakes being made by our national government, but when we see that the country can summon to its support men of the type who are now serving it, we take heart and our faith is renewed. I am proud of the men associated with me. They are men of the West, men of lofty purpose and high ideals, men who are making financial sacrifices to serve their country.

"The significance of this dinner lies in the spirit that animates you who are here. You have come without regard to partisanship to pay the tribute of respect to the government of our common country. We are citizens of one country and a country of which we are proud and to which we are devoted.

"We have come to the time when we pay no attention to the label a man wears but to the service he gives. That is the all important point. Our country has come to the point where it pays but scant respect to the label of the men they place in office, but it insists that their duty and loyalty shall be not to a party or organization, but to all the people.

"If there is any part of the country that deserves well of the government it is Central Oregon and I am going to try to see that it receives its just recognition. Portland is trying to build up the state at large and not selfishly working for itself alone. You make yourself great by helping others, whether you refer to an individual or a community.

"This administration is one which is not seeking to identify itself with the predatory interests, but with the common people. In the past we have had no consistent policy as to our land; the primary test is, can the man who wants the land use it and will he use it? The government wants the land put into use, not held from those who want to make use of it.

"The day is coming when Eastern Oregon will be one of the richest and most fertile and most thickly settled parts of your state. All that it needs is the water.

"I want to be a party to the development of your land and a party to the opening of the closed door of Alaska.

I want to see the government build, own and operate a railroad in Alaska so that the people may go in and the products come out. I expect to see Alaska a great state shipping coal and wheat and reindeer meat, fish and copper and all of the rest of her rich products, unhampered by those who would exploit that country for their own benefit alone."

"Due to the mines and the payrolls furnished by that industry in Montana, financial conditions there are somewhat better than in this part of Idaho. However, the crops there this year will not compare with ours, and in an agricultural way Idaho is far ahead of Montana. I had intended to extend my trip to western Canada but I heard such discouraging reports of conditions there that I decided it would be only a waste of time to do so. Farmers up there are said to be in a sorry plight, banks are failing, and business conditions are the worst ever experienced in that region. There is no question but what the Canada boom has been punctured."
