opinion of this fertile region.

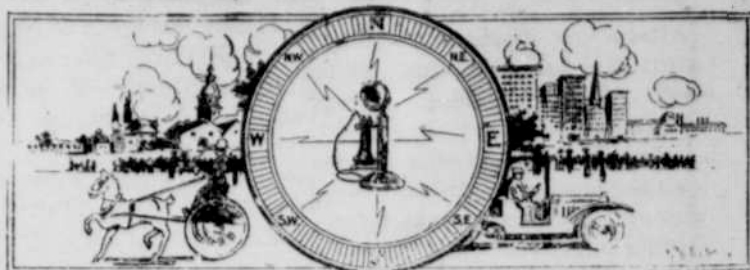
The cut prices on all kinds of
